In this addition of The Light you'll find information regarding our Summer Ministries. I'd like to highlight a few things for the Church.

In the winter of 2015 while living in Lubbock and attending FCC, Nick discerned a calling from the Father to attend seminary and prepare for leadership in congregational ministry. 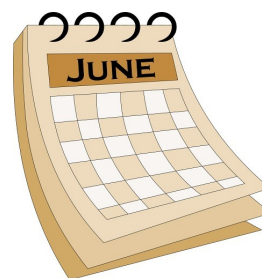
Second, I invite you to attend and/or pray for a **Mission Trip to Waco, TX, July 17-21 (Monday-Friday).** Hosted by Central Christian Church of Waco, we will split our days in half. The mornings will be spent connecting with a neglected neighborhood and engaging the community with love and with the Gospel. The afternoons will be supporting local Disciples of Christ ministries. The schedule also includes spiritual development time and evening events. This is a short-term trip (3 days of work total, with the other days for travel), and is intended for youth and adults. Younger children are invited as long as parents/guardians attend and remain responsible for them. **The purpose of the trip is to learn to share the Gospel, to grow together, and to build relationships with other churches from our denomination.** The suggested donation for the trip is \$75-\$100/person. Our face-to-face meeting with further instructions and vision is **Tuesday, June 13 from 12:00-1:00 PM in the Chapel Parlor.** Please call the church office if you have interest!

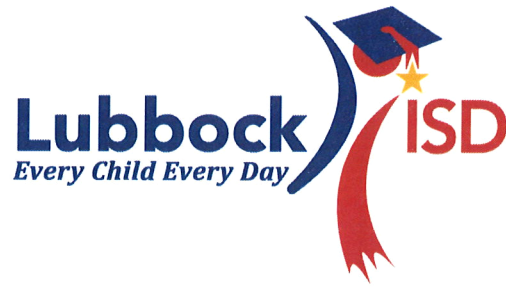

Saying Grace. . . Marilyn Wragg

My earliest regular exposure to prayer was through blessings over meals. From childhood, I can remember my family praying together before meals in our home or at extended family gatherings.

I have come to realize what a special gift that was. I have also come to recognize the immense value of regular mealtime prayers, which my grandparents called "saying grace." The practice is important for multiple reasons, which include the following:

- Saying grace provides a prayer connection with God two or three times daily. Once established, the habit becomes second nature. While I may occasionally neglect daily quiet time, Mike and I never forget to pray before every meal. For that reason, we often expand our meal blessing to cover other prayer concerns.
- It is a simple way to learn and practice prayer. Taking my turn saying grace was how I first learned to pray aloud in front of others. Long before I was comfortable praying a general prayer in public, I could readily pronounce a blessing before a meal. I started with rote prayers and then transitioned to my own expressions of thanks. This is a practice Mike and I have passed on, and it is a joy to hear our grandchildren express their unique versions of thanking God.
- Saying grace is a simple way to witness to others. When sharing meals in our home with believers who do not regularly pray, the brief blessing may provide a simple reminder to pray. For nonbelievers, the blessing may provide a needed connection to God. In a restaurant, unobtrusively saying grace with family and friends may provide a quiet witness to someone God puts within range—the impact of which will not be known this side of Heaven.
- Most important, saying grace acknowledges God as the source of our food and, indeed, of all our blessings. It reminds us over and over, in a culture where acquisition and self-sufficiency are paramount, that God is our Provider. When offered with heartfelt thanksgiving, it is an excellent way of expressing ongoing gratitude to our Heavenly Father.

And when He had said these things, He took bread, and giving thanks to God in the presence of all He broke it and began to eat. Acts 27:35

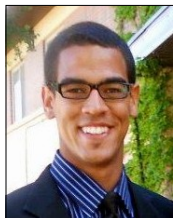


Dream Center Mission Trip- July 12th - 16th!!

Summer is Here!

6 Hour Overload- June 2nd: To kick off Summer break, we will host a game night on June 2nd from 6pm-12midnight. The night will include upbeat new games and old youth group favorites! Waco Mission Trip - July 17-21: This mission trip is open to the church adults and students alike. However, due to the maturity level required for this success of this trip, students must be at least 13 years old to participate. This trip will require participants to share faith with others. Thus, if you are not at the point where you feel like can talk to someone about your faith, this may not be the trip for you. All that being said, this will be a highly rewarding trip! We will be partnering with the lord to impact locals through the gospel, blessing the local DOC church in the area, and, of course, having fun along the way. Suggested donation is \$75-\$100. Again, this trip is open for adults and students. **Deadline to sign up is June 25th.**

***Transfigure - July 31-August 4th**: The vision of Transfigure is tied up in the story of Matthew 17:1-13...The Transfiguration of Jesus. By encountering Jesus in such a powerful way, we seek to enter back into our own worlds changed and energized.
