

oin me as we reflect on 2017 and pray for 2018. I share in our gratitude for our church family. I cannot imagine life without a people who share faith in the same Lord and a consistent concern for God's work in Lubbock. I don't say this enough, but I love our church. Faith, hope, and love flow at FCC, and our roots are strong. Mercy and justice thrive here as well, and the outreach of the Church alone is something to be grateful for.

I also appreciate the diversity of the Church while enjoying the strength of our unity in the Holy Spirit. One sign of health is the ability to be generous with people who approach life differently. This year I saw this generosity flow where matters of taste meshed well with differing opinions. The joining of our worship body for the month of December shows the joy of our unity and the generosity of our more contemporary families to gather on tradition. Thank you.


2017 did not see the increase of membership that we'd seen in 2015 and 2016. We're still a growing church, but our numeric growth slowed early in the year. 2017 was marked by two different moves in addition to growth: (1) The launching of small groups and an effort to add membership for our Sunday school classes; (2) A clarity on the Gospel of Jesus Christ, that the God of the Bible is gracious, glorious, and demanding – He demands and provides perfection. Anyone who has faith in the perfect work and person of Jesus Christ is counted as if we've never sinned.

I believe 2018 will be marked by two primary additions. The FIRST is an evangelistic focus. As the year begins I will share more of my recent experiences with sharing the Gospel with an international student who was drawn to enter our church in December. I was embarrassed by how rarely I am involved in this, and simultaneously ignited to jump into a life of evangelism. Many of us are overwhelmed at the thought of sharing the basics of our God and His Gospel. 2018 will be marked with equipping and encouraging our membership to share our treasure with the diversity of people who are drawn to Lubbock from all over the world.

The SECOND move in 2018 is not a program, but the work of the Spirit of Christ. Elijah set an altar in 1 Kings 18 so that the fire of the Lord would have a place to land. Along with many other churches in Lubbock, I believe we are to take the things of God (Gospel, Bible, Sacraments, our Fellowship) and call out to the Lord to bring revival in our city. We prepare the altar and God alone can bring the quickening Spirit. One city-wide event is on March 25, 2018 at 5:30 PM at Jones Stadium. Pastors and church leaders are gathering the Church of Lubbock (50,000 is our goal) for a night of prayer and singing. Spirit revival most notably includes the "normal" operations of the Holy Spirit: an increase in conversions, conviction of sin, assurance of our salvation, and a maturing toward holiness.

Given these two additions, I'm asking the Church to take January 14 through February 3, 2018 as a time of fasting and praying. Our fast does not move God into action, but it does build a greater hunger in the Church so that we can feast when God acts. It's like skipping breakfast on Thanksgiving Day — it's a smart move! As we remember 2017 and lean into 2018, may we do so with the assurance of God's grace and glory that we know in Jesus Christ.

As the storm moved inland torrential rains continued for days and flooded many areas in Houston and Pearland.


We will begin putting together a team of volunteers to take to Houston and help rebuild as well as love on the people and families who have been

Trust and Entrust ... Marilyn Wragg

Do you wonder what this New Year might bring? Are you looking ahead with hope, anxiety, or some of both?

As we enter 2018, there is no lack of turmoil. Highlighted in the daily news, upheaval pervades all levels of life. With so much uncertainty in our world and personal lives, it is tempting to let worry overcome our hearts—especially when specific uncertainties directly impact people we love.

To counteract these dangers, toils, and snares, consider adopting two watchwords for 2018: trust and entrust. By trust, I mean actively placing our faith in God. By entrust, I mean releasing those we love into God's care. The order of these two actions is critical, because we must absolutely trust God before we will entrust to Him our loved ones.

The question becomes: how can we more consistently trust and entrust?

It is essential to reaffirm our trust in God every single day, and as often throughout each day as worries surface. First and foremost, ask your Heavenly Father every day for faith to trust and entrust. Then, be intentional to focus on things that build trust in God; the scriptures shown are good examples. Make sure you more than balance secular input that breeds anxiety with reminders of God's love and faithfulness, which build peace. When anxiety does strike, take a deep breath and pray, "This alarms me because... But God, my trust is in You." When worries over a loved one surface, tell God how you feel and entrust that loved one to Him; "God, I am so worried about"; I know you love him. Help me entrust

Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God. Psalm 20:7

You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in You. Isaiah 26:3

Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in Him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that thrusts its roots to the stream. When the heat comes, it feels no alarm; its leaves stay green. It has no worries in a season of drought and never ceases to bear fruit. Jeremiah 17:7-8

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13

We cannot control most circumstances that cause anxiety. Nor do we possess power to protect our loved ones from all of life's snares. But we do have a Father Who reigns over everything (Psalm 47:8), for Whom nothing is too hard (Jeremiah 32:17), and with Whom all things are possible (Matthew 19:26).

It would seem the wisest thing God's children can do is intentionally to choose in all things to trust and entrust. Then, pray daily that God will enable us to do so.

Hearing from God

This entire Fall semester we spoke about LOVE. A real forever love that is hard for us to understand today because love has been misused and misguided.

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, and soul; and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus said these were the two greatest commandments but somehow through out history we began focusing on the 2nd and forgot about the first. Loving your neighbor without loving God becomes forced, fake, and overwhelming. I have heard many say they are burnt out. Who has ever heard of being burnt out over loving people?!

Love is giving and receiving. God gives us mercy, grace, and forgiveness and wants us to receive these gifts; as well as give him our heart, obey him and trust him.

My prayer has and will always be that these students continue to build in their relationship with the Lord. The last weeks leading up to the end of Fall semester we studied some of the greatest teachings of Jesus. In a crowd where a woman was accused of committing adultery and would be stoned to death for her sin, Jesus challenged the crowd to throw the stone if they themselves had never sinned. The crowd dropped their stone and walked away. Don't judge someone because their sin is different then yours.

In a crowd Jesus laid his hand upon a woman that had been bent over with disease for 18 years. For those 18 years all she could see was the dirt on the ground. After Jesus embraced her she straightened up and for the first time this woman could see into Jesus' eyes. She saw the crowd. She saw their pain, hurt, shame, pride, guilt, and sin. This woman and the crowd were changed that day. They were set free. Freedom is laying your secrets down at the cross.

In a crowded home where people gathered around this man called Jesus, four friends carried their paralyzed friend to Jesus. When there was no room in the house they did not give up; they climbed to the roof of the house carrying their friend and began digging through the roof. They then laid their friend at the feet of Jesus. Because of their faith this paralyzed man's sins were forgiven and he was able to walk. Would you do what it takes to get someone to Jesus?

Do you carry a stone? Do you throw stones? Are you so bound by your own sins that you spend your day pointing out the sins of others? Are you willing to let Jesus hold you in order for him to show you God? In this very church we have people from all over, with different backgrounds, different stories, different interests and dislikes. We have people from divorced families, who have been divorced, single parents, families, and with parents who have been happily married for years; people who have been raised in a church, forced to go to church, those who have been hurt from the church, or some who may just now be stepping foot in a church. We are the crowd! Are you willing to let Jesus show you God?

Hearing from God is not all that difficult. In fact you heard from Him already and that's why you are here! The problem is not God, it is that we stop listening.

God showed Elijah miracle after miracle but when his life was at risk he ran and hid. We expect God to show up in these huge miraculous ways through signs and storms. But when God showed up to Elijah he did not show up in the wind, the earthquake, or the fire. He spoke to Elijah in a "gentle whisper."

This New Year, recognize God, the God that lives within you, the God that loves you, the God that is always speaking to you, it just may be a gentle whisper. Sit in silence, yes it's uncomfortable or you don't have time, but do it anyway because God is there and He is speaking to you. Don't trust in your ability to hear Him, trust in

God's ability to speak! "Be still and know that I am God"
