

37,000 Focus Our ministry toward Tech

ow does God use our congregation to impact the world? This question was the biggest takeaway I received from our 21 days of fasting and prayer. The clearest answer that came was, "God uses us to invest in people. This is how God changes the world through His church." The only treasure we can bring with us from earth into heaven are other people. The wise in the Lord will strive in the sacred work of transferring wealth and resources into eternal treasure. We are called to invest in people as God has invested in and loved us.

Unique to our church is our relationship and proximity to a major, world-class University – Texas Tech. People come from all over the world to Lubbock and then return to all over the world. FCC has a calling and opportunity to "disciple people from all nations" without ever leaving Lubbock. Focusing on this distinct ministry will further connect us to our roots and enhance all of our other ministries. Imagine our fellowship connected and invested in 1% of the students at Tech – that's 370. This ministry should include connections to LCU, South Plains, and Wayland as well.

Not one of us is stronger than all of us. This vision casting is to move across our entire membership. Every member will be asked and encouraged to engage this calling. Over the next few months you will be invited to prayerfully explore how God will use you for His glory in changing the world through FCC.

This impact will require four things: (1) Faith in this calling and a partnership with God. (2) Generosity and an eagerness to invest in this generation. (3) A personal engagement with this ministry. (4) A growing holiness through a relationship with God.

As we take steps forward and lean on our past, our staff and ministry team leaders are working to create opportunities for you to engage in this holy work. We will hold a ministry fair on Sunday, April 15th through the morning to give you a chance to commit to old and new ways of ministering to students. On Saturday, May 12th I will ask the church to pause at home at 5:30 PM to prayerfully consider how God is calling you to respond in financial generosity toward missions, discipleship, and outreach.

Most of this mission is desire based. Much of our church loves to attend Tech athletic events, concerts, and the general life of the university. Let's attend these things not for us, but for Jesus. Pray, engage, and welcome the students. Let's learn how to trust the Holy Spirit in conversations on campus. When a student courageously walks into our church building, let them know that we are here to welcome and invest in them. With the Gospel, Bible, sacraments, and Christian relationships God will continue to change the world through our West Texas Church.

Get Ready + Get Set = Go !!!!!! Repairs and Renovations Now Underway

Thanks to funding provided through the accumulation of excess annual operating funds over the past several years, a few major repairs and renovations are now underway.

The flat roof portion on the entire main building is finally being replaced. The 28+ year old tar and gravel roof served us well for many years. However, it reached a point where we experienced a new leak during almost every rain. Over the next 30-45 days, a new modified rubber roof is being installed; one which should give us several decades of good service.

If you normally park on the 13th street side of the building, please plan to park in another area of the property over the next month. We will be staging the roof job from the parking spaces along 13th street, so these spaces will not be available.

On March 5, work will begin to replace the old steel doors at the west entrance with new glass doors. These will match the doors on the Broadway and East entrances that were installed over the last couple of years. In addition, work will begin to renovate the Great Hall. New ceiling treatments, lighting, and paint will upgrade and slightly modernize the look and feel of the Great Hall. This should provide a much better welcome to all those entering the building, especially first time visitors.

Over the next month, please understand that these projects will create some "mess." We will do our best to have construction dust cleaned up daily. However, there my be a few weeks when the Great Hall is a "work in progress" as you walk through on Sunday morning.

These renovations were approved by the General Board back in 2012. We thank God for providing our Finance Committee the patience and discipline needed to accumulate the funds in cash to complete these projects. We are grateful that none of the funding comes through debt financing. Our congregation is blessed to remain debt free.

Thank you for your understanding while this work is underway.



The Gospel of Matthew

Matthew's gospel is the longest of four, and many believe it was the first to be written. All four gospels were the accurate and true history of the life of Christ.

Before Matthew becomes one of Jesus' 12 disciples, he was a tax collector in the town of Capernaum. Matthew was called Levi by Luke and Mark. So when reading those gospels remember that Levi and Matthew are the same. It was not uncommon for a person in those days to be given a different name after an encounter with God.

Matthew who was a tax collector before his encounter with Jesus was totally despised by their culture because they worked for the Roman government and made themselves wealthy by collecting taxes dishonestly from their own people who made them very rich. Tax collectors were seen as very sinful people, so sinful that spending time with them could tarnish a good person. So when Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, with many other tax collectors and sinners, the Pharisees began questioning Jesus' choice of companions.

Matthew 9:10-13 ~Jesus' response here is one of the clearest explanations of God's heart and His gospel to man. This is just the beginning of how God worked in Matthew's life.
