



Trust and Give Thanks . . . Marilyn Wragg

Going into 2018, I suggested adopting the watchwords *trust* and *entrust*. *Trust* means actively placing our faith in God; *entrust*, **releasing into God's care those people and** things we care about. As I find myself daily tempted to worry and be anxious, it is already time for me to recommit to those action words of faith.

- Praise God that He is trustworthy and Sovereign. Pray to grasp and believe it.
- "I praise You God that You are Sovereign over all things! You have proven your trustworthiness again and again. Please help me grasp and believe that."
- Thank God for blessings in your life—especially blessings related to things that cause you to worry or be anxious.

Grace and peace to you. We are called by Jesus to the Great Commission in Matthew 28. "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in eh name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...". What a blessing it is to see God at work reaching out to people all over the world through His ministries at First Christian Church.

Over Spring Break, 4 of us, 2 college students, myself and my son, departed from Lubbock to meet up with a group of 10 other people from around Texas and begin this missions journey together. We traveled to Puerto Rico to fulfill the mission calling that He put on our heart not knowing what to expect. Once we arrived in Puerto Rico we were greeted and housed by the YWAM group in San Juan. YWAM is an evangelical interdenominational, non-profit Christian, missionary organization that our church had the pleasure of hosting in November of 2017 when they came to Lubbock to do mission work. I immediately became close in relationship with this group. This relationship has flourished and continues to grow as we partner with them to do mission work locally, nationally, and internationally.

The majority of our trip was spent in the mountains in a community called Cortizol. This community is so far up in the mountains that FEMA was unable to get to the people and the community. Many of the houses are still in ruins and the people are living in refuge camps or camping out wherever they can find temporary housing.

On this trip we focused on hurricane relief efforts and more specifically we went to help a man by the name of Julio Ortiz. Julio has had a tough go at life, losing his wife and then shortly after developed tongue cancer. The doctors tried everything to save his tongue but there was nothing they could do so he has lost his tongue and the ability to communicate with others. He works 12 hour days plowing a field next to his home where he grows vegetables and fruits and this has been his form of income. However, since the hurricane came it destroyed his home and his land leaving him with little ways to provide for himself.

God put together this crazy team from all over Texas, with different skill sets, and different life experiences to build this house. We met some obstacles along the way. Of course

lumber is hard to come by in a nation that was totally destroyed by hurricanes and we had to go to five different cities and 8 different lumber yards in 3 days to find all the materials needed to build his home. Supplies are also very highly priced in Puerto Rico because of demand, so the price of this trip was very high. Because of your giving and praying we were able to build Mr. Julio a home, as well as, clear out debris from his land so he could begin preparing for crop growth.





It took us four long days to complete his home. Upon completing his home we saw the most emotion our of Mr. Julio then we had seen this entire trip. He was teary eyed, and giving us hugs and posing for pictures which had been rare for him to do this entire trip. When we finally were packing up to leave we saw him unloading the shed that he had been living in and moving into his new home with belongings that had been salvaged by the hurricane.


We were unaware of the beliefs that Mr. Julio had. This man who was distant from the beginning of our arrival, wondering and questioning why people from Texas would come and help him with his home became a man who, when we left, told us that he was seeking a relationship with Jesus. I'm sure there are many questions that Mr. Julio had but one that he continued to ask was, what was our motivation for being here? It was a perfect opportunity for us to say, "We love Jesus and that allows us to love you. That is why we are doing this." So despite not quiet being able to articulate his words and tell us what his relationship with Christ is, he did say that he is pursuing a relationship. We can only pray that future trips that we make to Puerto Rico we are able to meet with him and see that he is on fire for the Lord and begins to share his own testimonies.

We appreciate you partnering with us and sending us. If it wasn't for you this trip would not have happened and this house would not have been built. A dream and desire that was placed on our hearts would not have been fulfilled without your prayers and financial help. Julio was one life out of many that was impacted on this trip and we are so blessed and grateful to have had you partner with us.
