



A Message From Rev. Carpenter ...

Pray for the USA every day at 8:00 PM

'm not always proud of all our decisions as a nation, but I remain grateful to be born and raised in this country. We face serious challenges. The greatest challenge is that we do not love each other. A nation falls most often without a shot fired. We corrode from within, for "a divided house cannot stand."

I believe we will remain unable to grow in love for each other and prevented from building together unless we repent and behold the beauty of our Maker. But first, I believe repentance is needed for the Church of Jesus Christ. We are the spiritual leaders, called forth from every nation. We reside in every country as resident aliens ourselves. We are citizens of a coming Kingdom even as we seek the welfare of the temporary nation we call "home". Here are a few of my thoughts regarding our leadership and influence:

<u>First</u>, we are called to know and be known by our Father through the Lord Jesus Christ. Your personal growth in the Lord is essential to affect this nation. The way we vote or exercise great secular power is not our greatest strength, although they are unique gifts to US citizens. The Word and Promises of God are our hope, and the joy of the Lord is our strength. If you care for the USA, begin by drawing nearer to God through prayer, confession, and gathering with your local church. We preach Christ above all things – way above Republican or Democrat. Consider this your primary state of being.

<u>Secondly</u>, the scriptures tell us to pray. Consider this your primary work. At times we are fooled by the world that prayer is preparation, and voting, working, striving is the real work. Those other things are of value, but the real mountain mover is praying with faith. God's Kingdom isn't built by human hands, but is received by faith. I'm asking you to recommit to daily prayer for the welfare of the USA. We will be passing out wrist bands again reading – "PRAY for the USA... 8:00 PM". Set your alarm as a reminder and join others in our sacred work of bringing this country to the feet of the Lord. God bless the USA!

Third, evil is real. People do things; some good, some bad, some awful. But our enemy is not of flesh and blood (Eph 6:12). Do not blame complex problems on a small group of people; and do not put solutions in another group of people. The Church of Jesus Christ should not lose our footing as a prophetic people. We who understand the complexities of sin, evil, grace, and the long-shot biblical vision of God's re-creation of this world must be a voice for the love and truth of Jesus Christ. By the way, Jesus confounds all political stripes. He calls us all to Him, but does not reiterate our secular beliefs. So we should know the Lord and His Kingdom through prayer and scripture. We are saints — called forth to be set apart for a holy use. Let us be used by God alone. Even in our political activities, may we speak and live with integrity willing to step out as a lone voice at times.

<u>Fourth</u>, God is with us and will not forsake the work of His hands. Our greatest hope is in God's ultimate control, guidance, and end-goals of sending a Kingdom from heaven onto the earth. Many will enter His Heaven through faith in Jesus Christ and every concern will be redeemed. This should cause us to be more involved with the affairs of this earth, but not from an earthly perspective. We don't flee from problems, nor do we hope in simply secular solutions. If God does not forsake His creation, neither should we. God does not send us into this nation to take, but to give. God did not give to us when we were deserving, but undeserving. Let us be generous with prayer, love, and heart-to-heart engagement. Let us keep our words salted with the Gospel. Let us do the "good" that the Spirit leads us to do. Remember, God decided to have a church that would know and submit to His mission. Let's make this season of challenges count by doing things the Father's way with Christ's love and the Holy Spirit's power.

Because the state of our nation is heavy on my heart, I have recommitted to pray every day for the USA. As reminders, I reset my daily smartphone alarm and resumed wearing the wristband provided two summers ago by our church to "PRAY for the USA, Everyday 8 PM."

While I do pray over specific circumstances, I foremost acknowledge that I am not smart enough to direct God to detailed outcomes for the messes at the forefront of daily news. Indeed, the older I grow, the more I adhere to Proverbs 3:5: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding."

I believe the most powerful prayers we can pray are those based on God's word and God's promises. 


My Dearest Church Family,


