Life's Burdens

Some hymns mean much more in different stages in our lives. "Precious Lord, Take My Hand" has been on my heart for much of the Fall. I know many in our church are in a season of weakness. Songs of comfort in the midst of loss are waiting for us when it's our turn to call out to Jesus, "Take my hand, lead me on, let me stand, I am tired, I am weak, I am worn."

Can you imagine closing your eyes to pray, and breaking through the pain to speak to heaven. As you pour out your heart, suddenly an unseen hand holds yours. Precious Lord, take my hand.

In Romans 8, St. Paul teaches that difficult times and suffering cannot separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Instead, hard times draw us nearer to Him. Our unity with Jesus and God's love for us holds fast even as the billows crash, even through the valley of the shadow of death. Do not be deceived into thinking that suffering is a sign of lack of faith or the negligence of our Father. As you suffer, remember that you are a child of God and that this season is producing a glory that is incomparable to the temporary pain.

As presented by Jim Evans in the October 7 worship service, we at FCC are partnering with Christian Relief Fund (CRF) in Amarillo, taking advantage of a wonderful opportunity for matching funds. The

Outreach Committee enthusiastically voted to utilize \$5,000 from this year's budget which will be matched by a CRF donor so that we can drill a water well in this area. We will receive the GPS coordinates and updates on our well as it progresses, and best of all, in every place a well is drilled, a church is planted to bring streams of Living Water and the gospel message of Jesus Christ! God has blessed us to be a blessing to others, and we thank Him.

In the Life of the Church...by Deborah Bigness

Kitchens all over Lubbock were unusually busy in November 1965. When members of the congregation expressed "their Christian concern for men in the service who will be unable to be home for Christmas," Dr. Dudley Strain challenged each family to contribute four pounds of fudge, divinity, peanut brittle, or other hard candy for a shipment to Viet Nam. By the next morning, Church Administrator Johnnie Davis told the *Lubbock Avalanche Journal*, "There's no question in my mind we will have more than a ton of candy."



By the deadline only four days later, 543 cans of candy were being packed in cartons and labeled with Christmas wishes. The 3,000 church and community cooks and helpers signed a scroll that accompanied the shipment as it traveled from Reese Air Force Base to San Francisco and then by military air cargo plane to Viet Nam. Film footage of the candy being unloaded was included in Ken Burns' recent documentary, *The Viet Nam War*.

"See To It That You Are Not Alarmed" ... Marilyn Wragg

Things sometimes look bad. Often, they look really bad. Trouble abounds in our world, country, and families. Daily, we hear news of natural disasters and human conflicts. Should Christians be surprised? Should we be alarmed?

No! Many times, Jesus told his followers to expect trials in this life. "Such things must happen." "In this world you will have trouble." "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars." "As they persecuted me, so they will persecute you."

What, then, did Jesus say to do? *"See to it that you are not alarmed."* "See to it" is a command to act. "See to it" puts responsibility squarely on us.

How, then, can we see to it that we are not alarmed? Below are a few suggestions. As you pray, ask God to reveal through His Holy Spirit how <u>you</u> specifically can "See to it that you are not alarmed."

- Daily renew your trust in God. Spend time in God's Word, and remember God's promises.
- Daily renew your faith. Reflect on God's attributes. Remember His past help.
- Thank God for blessings every day, and ask for eyes better to recognize them.
- Daily preach the Gospel to yourself.
- Daily ask the Holy Spirit to fill you and enable you to be a light to others.
- Pray, pray, pray. "Do not be anxious about anything..." See to it!!

Know Your Foundation

Light of youth

The God of All Creation

What was that saying again? What would Jesus do ...?

I find myself coming back to this statement of a question because of its sheer power. It's an encouraging, joy-driven, love bearing question that seeks to get it right just as the Savior of the cosmos did and still does. The question I've presented is a question that has driven much of my take on evangelism, missions, and service in my walk with Christ. Too often do we get struck with a paralyzing confusion as to how to interact with creation and what God asks of us through that interaction. These points of confusion can look anything like choosing to pick up a piece of trash outside or walk by it, choosing to pick up the abandoned dog on the street corner or leaving it there, or deciding whether or not to go to your gay friend's wedding. At first, these statements bring about self-reflection and maybe anxiousness (depending on who you are) but I believe that the question first presented in this article shines a light of clarity into these seemingly messy decisions. The Christ that we see in the Gospel, The Jesus that we see in the Scriptures, and the Messiah we see through the Spirit all have compassion. Jesus continually reveals the *Imago Dei*, that is the image of God, which is inherently built in to all creation and by that inherent-ness Jesus continually is in solidarity with people, continually reconcile things back in to God, continually is showing compassion for all of creation. We see all this by being led by our conviction to walk as Christ walked. I hope we see Christ as this masterpiece and the Holy Spirit as the sculptor and ourselves as this clay being molded and shaped to look like the masterpiece every day. May this constant shaping lead us to see creation as Christ see creation and encourage us to walk as Christ walked.
