Nudge me daily to pray for each next step, and give me faith to walk in it.


In the Life of the Church

Celebrating the nation's original First Couple George and Martha Washington with a fancy tea became a popular social event during America's centennial in 1876. The tradition still exists today. On Tuesday, February 22, 1910, (Washington's birthday) guests to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Cathey were greeted by Miss Alice Bledsoe dressed as George Washington and Miss Delia Wilkinson as Martha Washington to celebrate what the Lubbock Avalanche called, "in all probability the most brilliant social event of the season given under the auspices of the Ladies Aid Society of the Christian Church." The festivities included hostesses and musicians in costume, candlelight, red,




white and blue decorations throughout the house, portraits of the honorees, tea, cake, cream, and hatchet souvenirs for each guest. The newspaper notes that, "Despite the bad weather, a large number were present in the evening and all were very liberal with the offering."

Helping Families in Need

Have you heard about Family Promise and FCC's active volunteer support of this great program? If not, we want to offer you the opportunity to learn about Family Promise and the great job FCC volunteers are doing.

MISSION

Family Promise of Lubbock's mission is to provide homeless families with children the tools necessary to achieve long term financial, parental and personal self-sufficiency through a comprehensive program of temporary housing, case management and supportive services.

FAMILY PROMISE HISTORY

Lubbock Interfaith Hospitality Network, a nonprofit, nondenominational, volunteer-based organization, opened its doors in the fall of 1998 reaching out to homeless families with children. In early 2006 Lubbock Interfaith Hospitality Network changed its name to Family Promise of Lubbock. This newer name consists of simple words that deliver a powerful message of hope. It is a pledge of our commitment to help families with children achieve stability and self-sufficiency.

Family Promise partners with religious congregations, community organizations and local social service organizations to help families achieve sustainable independence. We are one of 200 Family Promise affiliates operating in 42 states; we are linked by membership to the National Family Promise in Summit, NJ.

WHERE DO FAMILIES LIVE?

First Christian Church and Family Promise partner together in providing a safe and comfortable place to stay while the families are in the program. A home located on the corner of 13th & Ave W (behind our Family Life Center) provides housing for up to five family units at a time. A kitchen and living/dining area allow families to have meals and family time in a traditional home setting.

WHAT DO OUR VOLUNTEERS DO?

Family Promise works with several churches who act as hosts for the families living in the Family Promise house. Families return to the home each day after working, school or other activities. This is when our volunteers arrive to the house to provide on-site oversight. The evening host is responsible for setting up food for

the evening meal (meal is provided by a volunteer as well), visiting with the families and occasionally providing activities for the children. Evening host positions require a 3.25 hour commitment for one evening.

An overnight host arrives at 8:30 p.m. to relieve the evening host. The overnight host has no duties other than to be available in the event of an emergency. It is recommended the overnight host bring a sleeping bag or bed linens for their bed. The overnight host sleeps in a private bedroom and may sleep from "lights out" to 6:00-6:30 a.m. All families and the overnight host leave the house at 7:00 a.m.

In addition to the above hosts positions, volunteers provide a dinner meal each evening for the families. The amount of food needed varies depending on the number of families living in the home during our volunteer week. Since many of the individuals in the Family Promise program are children, kid-friendly foods are suggested.

HOW DO I VOLUNTEER?

Prior to each volunteer week, you may visit our Sign-Up Genius page and select the date and volunteer activity you want to participate in. We guarantee you will be richly blessed by sharing your time and talents with the parents and children of Family Promise.







Know Your Foundation—The Beginnings... by Lynn Williams and Marilyn Wragg

The First Christian Church Foundation was established in 1959 by an act of the official board of the congregation with the initial gift of \$5,000.00 from Monroe G. and Mollie D. Abernathy and an equal amount from Mr. and Mrs. George Kuykendall. Mrs. A.E. Coffman gave \$25,000 to the Foundation in memory of her husband. The Brock-Farris Scholarship Fund was established within the Foundation by Mrs. J.A. Brock in 1969.

In 1970, \$245,000 from the estate of J.A. Hodges was received forming a loan fund for pre ministerial students or for those engaged in continuing education in the work of the church. By action from the First Christian Church Board, the Foundation was assigned the responsibility of administering these funds of the Hodges Estate.

Over the past six decades the Foundation has grown significantly in dollars and scope. Next month's article will highlight some of the blessings afforded by your FCC Foundation since it's beginning 60 years ago.
