'm writing this newsletter article from Florida during our annual family vacation. My parents, along with all of my siblings, gather with our families each year to love, support, and encourage each other. I'm dedicating this article to the ministry of the family, and how God uses ordinary people like brothers and sisters, moms and dads, to impact our hearts and minds for the better. First, one of the earliest showings of God's sovereignty in our life is Him determining our family. Some of us became family through adoption and others through biology; either way we can't help but see the hand of God in picking who are closests relationships would be. Your life and your family is not an accident but one of the ways God chooses to bless and humble us. For every family has great things and every family has unique challenges. The family God has given to Valerie and me is in some ways like my family of origin and in many ways different. In both cases it's clear that God assembled our families and cherishes them deeply. During family vacations I can't help but consider at how God has been with our families for generations and generations.

Second, a family that knows and honors God naturally disciples, evangelizes, and glorifies God. The biggest decision a person can make is to follow Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. The same is true for a family. This puts us on a unique road that God blesses and uses for our good and His glory. As we're here in Florida, I see my mother who prays for all of her children and grandchildren every day and my father who leads us biblically and serves his local church as an elder. I see my brothers lead their wives and children as Christ loves the church, and along with my grandmother we discuss what is going on in our faith walk. Each night we gather on the beach and stand amazed at the handiwork of God. A faith based family is a gift that keeps on giving-normalizing prayer and praise.

Third, God is ready to redeem any family that will call on Him. While we all appreciate faith based homes sometimes it's

We've hard relate. all been to disappointed and embarrassed bv situations in our families. One thing is for certain: if faith is not the center of our homes God is willing and ready to help us make it so. Regardless of the level of faithfulness to Jesus found in your family consider these basic truths in order to pray directly for God's help. Statistically when the dad/husband begins to walk with Jesus the whole family tree is altered: zero in on fathers and husbands to know Jesus as Lord and to lead well. One of our members, Michael King, mentioned another law at work called the "80-20" rule. Either you are a family who is plugged into church 80% of the time or 20% of the time. If you are a family active in a local church you will certainly see the effect of faith and the practice of Christianity in your home. If you find yourself in a season of being a 20% family, recognize it and ask God for help to become an 80% family. The last principle I'd like to highlight is the attraction of holy things in our homes. Where is the place of praver, scripture study, open conversations, and confession within our homes? If you've got kids or grandkids under your care, are they willing to come to you to talk through some of life's greatest difficulties and mysteries? Is the name of Jesus used with reverence. and joy? God is ready to bless any home that is willing to call on Him.

Hezekiah's Prayer Marilyn Wragg

2 Kings 18–19 provides another example for praying in difficult circumstances. With a massive army on his doorsteps, King Hezekiah faced insurmountable odds. Assyria had already conquered the northern kingdom of Israel and deported its inhabitants. Sennacherib had captured all fortified cities of Judah and now threatened utterly to destroy Jerusalem and its people unless they surrendered and were deported.

Assyrian commanders taunted Judah and their God, boasting about nations and gods they had handily decimated. Sennacherib sent a letter warning Hezekiah not to depend upon his God: "Who of all the gods of these countries has been able to save his land from me? How then can the Lord deliver Jerusalem from my hand?"

When Hezekiah read the letter, he took it directly to the temple, spread it out before the Lord, and prayed.

Hezekiah's example has helped me through some dreadful situations. The next time you face a crisis, remember Hezekiah. Take the threat, however tangibly you need to, straight to God. Remember and call on God's attributes. State your request. Then, leave it to God to act in a way that furthers His glory.

Upon reading the letter, Hezekiah went straightaway to the temple and physically spread out the letter before the Lord.

Hezekiah recited God's mighty traits not only to praise God and entreat His deliverance, but also to remind himself of what he knew about God. Facing terrifying odds, Hezekiah needed to remember that his God alone was Sovereign.

Hezekiah then asked God to act in a way that would further His glory – "So that all may know that You, alone, Lord, are God."

> "Lord, God of Israel... You alone are God over all kingdoms of the earth. You have made heaven and earth. Give ear, Lord, and hear; open Your eyes, Lord, and see; listen to the words Sennacherib has sent to ridicule the living God. It is true, Lord, that the Assyrian kings have laid waste these nations and have thrown their gods into the fire, for they were not gods but only wood and stone. Now, Lord our God, deliver us from his hand, so that all kingdoms of the earth may know that You alone Lord, are God." 2 *Kings 19:15–19*

And finally, remember that we cannot always see how God is working for good. But we can trust, in the words of Pastor Paul, "that God's glory and our good have been inextricably linked through Jesus."

Whenever I was the interim Youth Pastor in Amarillo, I recall one specific trip my partner and I had planned. This trip was our Middle School Mystery trip, it was a weekend full of fun, joy, laughter, and best of all throw up.....yes, throw up. Of all the things that I recall on the trip, the most distinct is how sick and queasy everybody got during this adventure. I bring that up because as people hurled threw the night, our friendships also kindled and sparked. It's as one of my professors called it "vomit ministry!" What he was getting at by using this term was that when

one person gets sick/ throws up it causes someone else to become vulnerable and susceptible and eventually throw up themselves. It was glorious! I got to be in the midst of watching this term play out but by the end of the weekend, after all the messes were cleaned up, all the tears were wiped away, and all our bags were headed home, we were much closer. We had shared in vulnerability and in hurt, which in turn led us to unite with each other that



much more. I believe this whole idea of "Vomit Ministry" is one we can use in our faith walks today, excluding the actual vomit. The sharing of vulnerability and authenticity, leads others to likewise be vulnerable and authentic. I have often shared my weaknesses and how the Lord has brought me out of so much darkness and this has inspired people to do likewise. In the Bible belt, it's easy to cover our problems with a Christian mask where we don't allow anyone to see our sins, my struggles, our imperfections because the thought of being vulnerable scares us. To bare ourselves in all of our emotional and spiritual nakedness is terrifying, and Satan wants to keep it that way. Satan would love for everyone to claim a perfect lifestyle yet in the shadows be choked away by their sins. I truly believe Christ is calling us to a life of vulnerability, where no matter the pain or fear involved with baring our lives to others, we do so anyway. The Church is empowered by their testimony and vulnerability, Satan's power is re-vanquished when we expose him and his ploys to the light. I hope even after reading this you'll be encouraged to share with a friend, a child, a stranger, or a loved one what the lord is doing in your life. May we all allow God's radiant light to expose us for who we truly are, his children.

In the Life of the Church... by Deborah Bigness

On August 10, 1943, First Christian Church lost John R. McGee, one of its charter members. As the 1961 history of the church says, "The persistence of John R. McGee during those early years is largely responsible for there being a Christian Church in Lubbock."

Born in central Texas in 1853, Mr. McGee was a cowboy and a Texas Ranger in his youth. A lawyer by trade, he served as the County Treasurer in McCullough County for many years before coming to Lubbock in 1901, at a time when the town's population was approximately 300. That same year, Mr. Gee arranged for Elder Lay of Colorado City to come to Lubbock and officially organize the church.

Before the first resident pastor was hired in 1909, Mr. McGee was the official contact for the church, conducted last rites as a lay pastor and was the person that all of the members depended on in church matters. During these same years, he served six years as Lubbock County Judge, followed by six years as County Attorney, and was a prominent leader of several civic organizations.
