od continues to bless our church family. Winter and Spring at FCC has been fruitful with personal growth in faith, the addition of several new members, and the completion of a major facilities project (demolition of the two-story house on Broadway repairing/sealing our parking lots). It's important to remember with changes we are to be grateful for our past. The house which came down this March was a blessing to Lubbock and was used by God for decades – for domestic abuse crisis care to family promise's homeless ministries. As we honor the past we press on for the future.

I'm writing to make sure no one is missing out. From time to time life interrupts our church involvement and attendance. I've heard from a few of you who have recently gotten back involved at FCC after falling off for a time. Many of us will experience reasons to take a break from church – life will include pain, distractions, and grief; if you find yourself out of the habit of gathering with your church family, receiving communion, and growing in the scriptures, I'm encouraging you to jump back in as soon as possible. People's experiences and sharing with me have revealed a wandering path that if left untouched will become our new normal.

The Wandering Route – If we find ourselves away from the church, our faith becomes less and less active. Neglecting the practices of faith (prayer, openness, being surrounded with truth, reading our Bibles together) keeps us from listening to God and makes us less aware of His presence. We aren't actively "walking with Jesus." Our faith loses its daily power,

which leads to further isolation from our church family. The cycle continues until we are Christians at the surface level, but our lives are dangerously marked by the world, by fear, and with doubt. Jesus calls out in Revelation 3:2, "Wake up! Strengthen what remains of your faith!"

When we turn back to get involved, it's a joyous moment in the life of the church and in heaven! No shame, no judgment, no questions - only, "Praise God!" Some might say that we can grow in our faith while distancing ourselves from Christ's church - I have never found that to be the case. If you're reading this and feel it's time to get back involved at FCC and also to sense God's will and presence for your life, we celebrate and encourage any changes you'll have to make to draw near the holy things of God. If you'd like to reach out and tell me "Paul, we're trying!" Or if you would like to sit down with me, please text/call my cell 806-790-1066.

Your church is stable and strong. As life goes up and down, the Word of God remains steadfast. We are here for you that every Christian and every convert to the faith would only grow in their walk with Jesus. May God be glorified as we draw near to Him!


#### Practical Tips: Building Healthy Habits

One of the most common questions a pastor receives from someone who has just developed a desire to start feasting on the word is, "How do I get started?" Often, I find myself pointing others to scripture, a devotional, or the gospel of John as great starting places. But most people are like me...and most people find it hard to develop and stick with new habits. So this month, I decided to go on more of the practical side of how to develop healthy habits in our lives. Disclaimer: There is no simple way or magical process to fully integrate a healthy habit into your life style. It will require some level of intentional work. So here are the three things that may help you develop a new habit:

- 1. **Set a Goal:** If you just say, I want to \_\_\_\_\_ because I just want to, it probably wont turn out too well. Instead make sure you know "why" you are trying to develop this habit.
- 2. **Schedule it!:** In a world were we are increasingly becoming more busy, we have to get better at naming daily priorities. Start with 5 priorities each day and then make sure you put it on the calendar. Read scripture at 8am. Pray the last 5 minutes of each hour. If you don't actually write it down, it stays an idea rather than something concrete.
- 3. **Reward Yourself**: If you decide to go workout, treat yourself to a piece of candy. I hope these help! Regardless, never forget the real goal of everything we do: To live for the glory of God! Maybe that should be the first question we ask ourselves...Am I doing \_\_\_\_\_ for the glory of God?

- be extra "eyes" in the room and walk children to the restroom

**Why:** Pointing children to the "GOOD NEWS" of Jesus is the most important mission and opportunity we have and is of eternal significance. Many of these children are unchurched and are desperate for caring adults who model the love of Jesus with encouragement and joy.

An informational meeting will be scheduled later this summer and training will be held on the morning of Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> (as well as an additional training on September 21<sup>st</sup> for those who will be teaching the Bible lessons and/or talking to children about accepting Christ as Savior). #### Thank God for Dwelling in You ... Marilyn Wragg

#### Hannah's Prayers . . . Marilyn Wragg

FCC's daily Bible readings recently covered two prayers of Hannah. In 1 Samuel 1, we met Hannah, who had no children and was cruelly taunted by her husband's other wife. During the family's annual pilgrimage to worship God at Shiloh, Hannah went to the Lord's house; there, in deep anguish, she wept bitterly and prayed to the Lord. She asked God to remember her and give her a son, and she promised to give this son to God for life. After interacting with Eli the priest, Hannah "went on her way and ate something—no longer downcast."

Back home, Hannah became pregnant and gave birth to Samuel. After he was weaned, she took and presented him to Eli. "I prayed for this child, and the Lord has granted mo what Lasked of Him. So not

the Lord has granted me what I asked of Him. So now I give him to the Lord."

Hannah then prayed an awe-inspiring prayer, in which she rejoiced in God's marvelous attributes. Her song in 1 Samuel 2, referred to as "the Magnificat of the Old Testament," beautifully foreshadows Mary's song in Luke 1.

 When beset by anguish and grief, do what Hannah did—pour out your soul to the Lord. As the old hymn advises, "Take it to the Lord in prayer."

- After you have given your troubles to God, follow Hannah's example: get up and go on your way, no longer downcast. Once you cast your burdens on the Lord (1 Peter 5:7), entrust those burdens to Him.
- Like Hannah, know and focus on God's character. Read 1 Samuel 2 and note the attributes Hannah proclaimed. Had she not fully believed all this about God, Hannah's other actions would have been groundless. The extent of her relief and hope was directly proportionate to Hannah's view of God.

"There is no One holy like the Lord; there is no One besides You; there is no Rock like our God." 1 Samuel 2:2

God's word teaches us much about prayer. I have noted some principles I gleaned from Hannah's prayers. Reflect on 1 Samuel 1–2, and ask God what He would teach you. Then, apply that teaching to your personal prayer life.

#### In the Life of the Church... by Deborah Bigness

Seventy eight years ago, in June 1941, the congregation publicly announced the construction of a new church at Broadway and Avenue X. The vision detailed in that announcement was postponed while World War II raged, and for a time even after the War was won, due to restrictions on building materials.

Finally, On Sunday morning June 13, 1948, the *Avalanche Journal* reported that, "The congregation of the First Christian Church here has double reason for joyful worship today. They will worship for the first time in a newly-completed sanctuary, and will hear the first sermon by a new pastor, the Rev. Travis A.



White ..." The Reverend White would serve the church for the next five years. The church building announced in 1941, with so much hope for and faith in the future, is still our home today.




