Comfort yourself with the Word of God" – Martin Luther

Very soon you will receive a gift from the church in the mail. It's our 2020 Bible Reading Plan in calendar form. Several members took full advantage of last year's plan and encouraged us to provide one again. I'm eager to start the year committed to personal time in the Word of God, and to watch God comfort and instruct His people.

Our attitude and heart's focus is essential for proper reading of scripture. Alexander Campbell (one of the founders of our denomination) writes:

"Everyone who opens the Book of God, with one aim, with one ardent desire – intent only to know the will of God – to such a person the knowledge of God is easy; for the Bible is framed to illuminate such, and only such, with the salutary knowledge of things celestial and divine. Humility of mind, or what is in the effect the same, contempt for all earth-born preeminence, prepares the mind for the reception of this light; or, what is virtually the same, opens the ears to hear the voice of God" Taking Campbell's teaching, before I enter the scriptures, I prayerfully confess three things: (1) That my trust in the reliability of the scriptures is unshakable, even when I read things that offend my feelings or ways of thinking; (2) That I am hungry to receive God's gift to me by His counsel and Word – that each moment in scripture study is pure grace to me; (3) That what I'll read today fits in with what I've read in the past, even if there are tensions – all 66 books of the Bible (though written through several human authors) are all ordained and controlled by the Holy Spirit and are ultimately telling one glorious story of God's grace.

Join us this year in spending more time in the Bible. May God bless you and yours in 2020 with the fruit of Christ and the joy of the Holy Spirit.

Resolve to Treat Prayer More Seriously Marilyn Wragg

While cleaning out a desk drawer, I recently discovered an old spiral notebook in which I had recorded

prayer requests. The notebook spanned many years, and often there were several years between each list of requests. As I read through the prayers, I was amazed to see how God had worked over time in the life of each person. Looking back decades later, I could see God's grace and mercy through answered prayer in ways I never saw at the time. Many loved ones for whom I was praying have now passed to Heaven; recognizing God's faithfulness to carry each of them through their final challenges was a huge boost to my faith.

In order for me faithfully to persist in praying over a specific person or situation, I find it necessary to write out my prayers. The process of putting the request into words leads me to pray for discernment over what specifically to ask, which invites the Holy Spirit into the upfront process of framing requests. Later, it is often in those specifics that God's answers are most clearly visible.

I once read that in all endeavors, wise people assess how things turn out. That we do not regularly do so with prayer shows we do not treat it as seriously as other endeavors.

While I believe we will never know the total impact of our prayers until we reach Heaven, I also believe God graciously grants us many confirmations, if we take time to look expectantly for results.

The beginning of a New Year is an apt time to reflect over ongoing prayer requests and how God has worked in each life and each situation. Be sure to thank God for answered prayers. For those prayers still "in progress," seek to discern how best to continue praying in 2020.

Ask God to help you pray more earnestly and expectantly. Pray for the Holy Spirit to increase your faith that God is working when you cannot see it, and to give you eyes more clearly to see answers God is gracious to reveal.

Resolve this New Year to treat prayer as seriously as other endeavors you undertake. Pray more expectantly, and be more intentional to recognize and thank God for ways He is working.

IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH by Deborah Bigness

Sunday, January 22, 1967, was a day of double celebrations in the life of the church. On that afternoon, members gathered to formally dedicate our beautiful and distinctive octagonal Hodges Chapel. The new chapel was made possible by a gift to the church from J.A. and Helen Hodges and dedicated to the memory of their parents. Immediately following the formal dedication service, members celebrated the Hodges' Golden Wedding Anniversary in the new Chapel Parlour.

J.A. and Helen Hodges married in Dimmitt, Texas, on January 24, 1917, and immediately took up residence in Lubbock, where Mr. Hodges was in the hardware business. Their kindness and philanthropy not only made lasting contributions to the First Christian Church, but also to their chosen home. Two parks and a community center were donated to the city by the couple and each of them established scholarship programs through bequests that have benefited students for decades.

In the Book of Exodus, there is a large section of scripture, chapters 25-40, that is generally skipped over by most readers. This is mainly due to the fact that Exodus diverts from talking about the history of the Israelites and their wandering and jumps into giving the reader very precise details about the construction of the tabernacle and all that encompasses it. If this text is properly enjoyed, a beautiful image begins to form; the image of God's divine presence with his people. I mention this text/image because through it we begin to notice that the excruciating details included in this text are not simply to bore the reader but to paint a picture of the magnificent and beautiful dwelling place of God in the Old Testament.
