A Message From Rev. Carpenter

This past week thirteen members of FCC followed the guidance of the Holy Spirit to Oscar Duconge Park in the eastside of Waco, TX. The group included teenagers, pastors, staff, an elder, and involved members of the church. We spent four days sharing the Gospel through conversations, scripture, and storytelling; we listened to testimony and met several brothers and sisters in Christ. We also spent time visiting the ministries of three Disciples of Christ congregations in Waco. The general experience was a maturing and encouraging of the missionaries to be more awake and competent in connecting this world to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Here are a few lessons learned:

1. **"Go where you're supposed to go, and do what you're supposed to do."** The first night affirmed our discernment to minister in this neighborhood. The park was full and we met a handful of enthusiastic Christians excited to partner with this mission. This first lesson was critical because times would come that made me question if we were on a blessed trip or not. Some days we arrived and the park was a ghost town or our reception was cold and closed off. Without the assurance that we were supposed to be there and called to present the Gospel, we would have folded on the second day.
2. **"Your swords don't work here; set them down."** 100% of the group had to relinquish our default strengths. Our personal comfort zones vanished. Brittney came on the trip to lead children in singing and she lost her voice! I came to lead large groups and I couldn't speak to more than one person at a time! This was a lesson to not lean on predictabilities, but to trust a power and strength greater than ourselves. The quicker we embraced this, the faster we received a better sword – the Word of God. God moved in us most naturally when we were at the end of our rope.
3. **"Stop trying to relate to people."** It was tempting to find commonalities with folks – "You have three kids?! I have three kids!" or "You have a nose?! So do I!" Small talk had no value on this trip. Instead we moved to God, not to ourselves. After meeting someone, we'd say, "Do you know why we're out here?" We'd let them know that God was leading us and asked them if they knew the Lord. We related through Jesus and only through Jesus. It is freeing to know that the goal of evangelism isn't to have a life-long relationship with the whole world. Offer instead our greatest treasure, Jesus Christ.
4. **"God's plans are grand."** I spoke with an older man at a picnic table on the final day of our trip. He was a fountain of history, faith, and realistic optimism. He shared the worst stories of Waco, and the mighty movements of God. Much of his narrative centered on the park that God called us to stand in. He saw the worst of humanity; and he also saw miracles of the Lord. He perceived along with our mission team that the Father had big plans for that park and the surrounding neighborhood. It was humbling and encouraging to hear testimony of God's work over a long period of time.

5. **“God lifts up leaders and elders.”** From among the people, the Lord always lifts up authorized leaders. These are people of faith, patience, and genuine care for the flock. We met two of them: young men who were convicted by the Holy Spirit to be models of fathers in a fatherless neighborhood. Both had checkered pasts and were experiencing authentic repentance. Both had a gnawing passion to lead and influence the culture and spiritual life of their neighborhood. Elders and leaders aren’t always an official “office,” but provisions by our loving and mighty God. On our last night instead of sticking around for too long, we handed these two men the food and the leadership; we prayed for them, handed them bibles, embraced them, and then departed. I offered them our benediction, and we agreed that we would meet again on earth or in the resurrection.

Stayed tuned. The discipleship ministries of FCC will surely prioritize evangelistic maturing now and in the future. “After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. He told them, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field (Lk 10:1-2).’”

Wait on the Lord; Wait for His Spirit... Marilyn Wragg

"In the life of the Old Testament saints, waiting was one of the loved words in which they expressed the posture of their souls towards God. They waited for God and waited upon God." This quote from Andrew Murray's book, *The Spirit of Christ*, introduces the chapter on "Waiting for the Spirit."

Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart, and wait for the LORD.
Psalm 27:14

The Biblical concept of waiting as a blessed experience—even waiting on God—goes against the grain of today's culture. We live in a world of instant communication and on-demand access to goods and services. Many of us become frustrated when we have to wait in line or in traffic. When we are forced by circumstances beyond our control to wait for good things that are delayed or for outcomes that are uncertain, we can readily succumb to anxiety and agitation.

But those who wait on the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint. Isaiah 40:31

It can be all too easy for this displeasure with waiting to carry over into our spiritual lives. We desire the spiritual gifts our Lord promises, yet we lack the discipline to pray and wait for them. In his book, Murray says the reason so many believers know so little of the joy and power of the Holy Spirit is that "they never knew to wait for it."

So, what does waiting upon God look like? Just how do we go about waiting for a fuller manifestation of God's Spirit within us? Murray proposes four steps, which I have tried to summarize as follows:

1. As you enter your prayer closet daily, first sit still and acknowledge in faith that the Holy Spirit is within you, as a believer in Jesus Christ. Thank God that His Spirit dwells within you.
2. Ask God that His Spirit may work more mightily in you, in greater life and power. Believe that God hears and answers. Rest in what God is going to do, even when your feelings do not coincide.
3. Wait in quietness; force your soul to be still. Wait on the Lord; wait for the Spirit. Do your best to empty yourself and acknowledge your own poverty of spirit. Remember that Jesus pronounced blessing upon the poor in spirit.
4. Having thus waited upon God, get up and about the work that awaits you this day, in faith that the Holy Spirit within will guide you. Here, Murray advises, "If your experience appears to prove that it is not so, be sure this is simply to lead you onwards to a simpler faith and a more entire surrender."

I encourage you to join me in trying Murray's suggestions for waiting. "The Spirit is Himself already working in you. His full indwelling and guidance is your child's portion." We simply must learn to wait upon God; wait for the Spirit.

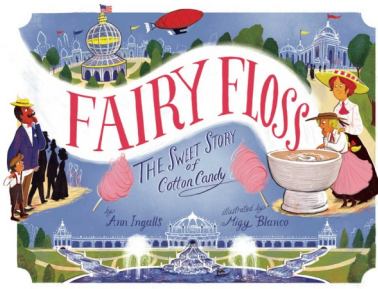

News From Noah's Nook!

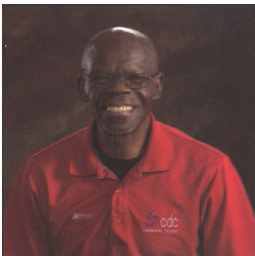

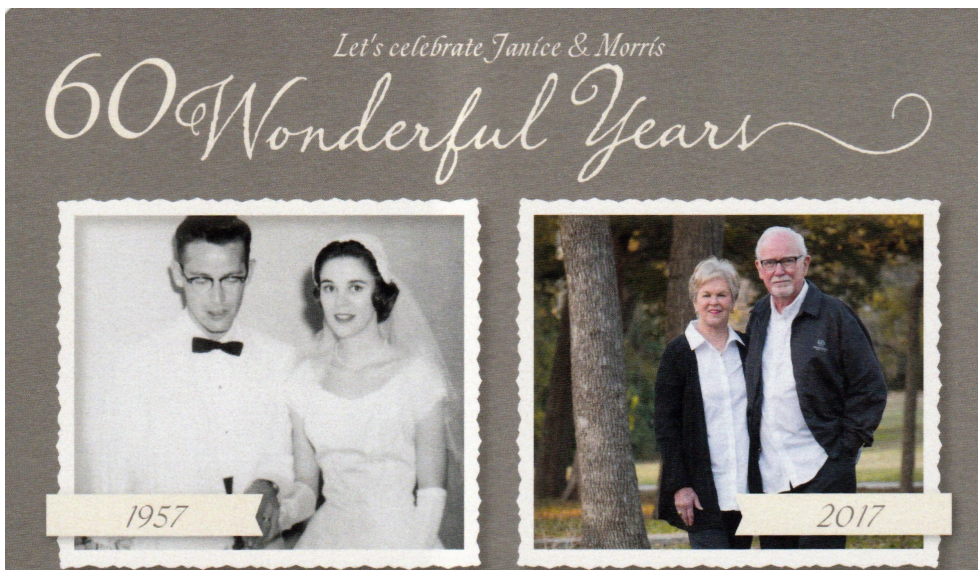
