A Message From Rev. Carpenter

s the Season of Lent approaches I'm writing to tease out the differences between what is coined the "therapeutic gospel" versus the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to scripture. The therapeutic gospel is an ingrained belief that we are all basically good and if the conditions around us improved most of our problems would dissolve. Professor David Powlison of Westminster Theological Seminary lists the basic desires drawn from this belief:

- I want to feel loved for who I am, to be pitied for what I've gone through, to feel intimately understood, to be accepted unconditionally.
- I want to experience a sense of personal significance and meaningfulness, to be successful in my career, to know my life matters, to have an impact.
- I want to gain self-esteem, to affirm that I am okay, to be able to assert my
 opinions and desires.
- I want to be entertained, to feel pleasure in the endless stream of performances that delight my eyes and tickle my ears.
- I want a sense of adventure, excitement, action, and passion so that I experience life as thrilling and moving.

In contrast to this popular view, the Gospel according to scripture does not affirm that our problems are outside of us only. In fact the question, "What's wrong with the world?" should be answered with each of us saying "I am." Here's the deal, Jesus did not come to make bad people good; he came to make dead people live. It's not about human goodness versus evil; it's about impotence and death versus abundance and life.

Ash Wednesday (which is coincidentally on Valentine's Day this year) includes an evening worship service at 6:00 PM. The imposition of ashes on our foreheads or hands forces the difference between the "therapeutic gospel" and the Good News of Jesus Christ: "Without intervention from God by grace, you are merely dust that will remain dust." But by God's grace and for His glory He moves to redeem the lost. According to Professor Powlison this reveals an entirely new list of needs and desires for us:

- I need mercy above all else.
- I want to learn wisdom, and unlearn willful self-preoccupation.
- I need to learn to love both God and neighbor.
- I long for God's name to be honored, for his kingdom to come, for his will to be done on earth.
- I want Christ's glory, loving-kindness, and goodness to be seen on earth, to fill the earth as obviously as water fills the ocean.
- I need God to change me from who I am by instinct, choice, and practice.
- I want him to deliver me from my obsessive self-righteousness, to slay my lust for self-vindication, so that I feel my need for the mercies of Christ, so that I learn to treat others gently.

A Message From Rev. Carpenter Continued...

- I need God's mighty and intimate help in order to will and to do those things that last unto eternal life, rather than squandering my life on vanities.
- I want to learn how to endure hardship and suffering in hope, having my faith simplified, deepened, and purified.
- I need to learn to worship, to delight, to trust, to give thanks, to cry out, to take refuge, to hope.
- I want the resurrection to eternal life.
- I need God himself.



Pray to Love Marilyn Wragg

It is quite special that the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, falls on **Valentine's Day this year. It is also rare; the last time the two days** coincided was 1945. When you think about it, this special occurrence **perfectly celebrates God's gift of love to us, as written in 1 John 4:8–**11. It also reminds us that our response ought naturally be to love one another. Many Scriptures teach what it looks like to love as we ought, such as 1 John 3:18.

Love, however, is not easy always to practice. We can say we love, even when we don't feel it. But we are called to go beyond words and speech. As a congregation, let's be especially intentional during this season of Lent to love as the apostle John instructed.

Love with actions. Our Lent booklet this year is "Practicing Love." It is a book of family devotions with scriptures, reflections, and ideas for putting love into practice that relate not only to families, but also

to persons of all ages and stages. Join with your FCC family in walking through this booklet and praying daily the prayer: *Jesus, I give You my heart with my acts of love today.*

Love in truth. It is possible to express love with speech and even with actions when we are not really feeling it. But it is impossible to love "in truth" when love does not genuinely flow from the heart. That is where prayer enters in. Only God, through His Spirit, can fill our hearts with genuine love that overflows to others.

Throughout this season, let's pray for God to enable us to love one another, not just outwardly through words and actions, but inwardly and truly from our hearts. A good way to start is to take Scriptures like 1 John 3:18 and 1 Corinthians 13:4–8 and pray them back to God.

God, help me today to love not only with words, but with actions and in truth. Help me be patient; help me be kind. Today, may I not envy or boast or be prideful. Give me presence of mind never to dishonor others or be self-serving. Don't let me be quick to anger or keep track of wrongs. Teach me not to delight in evil but to rejoice with the truth. Enable me always to protect, to trust, to hope, and to persevere in loving. I praise You that love never fails. Please, fill me with Your Spirit of Love, so my heart will overflow with love for others.





Search No More!

College is back and going strong but I realized that among all the differences we have, there is one thing we all have in common, we are searching. Searching for something. A new job, graduation, boyfriend, girlfriend, car, someplace to live, purpose, meaning, identity, fulfillment, healing, acceptance, the list goes on and on. But why? Why do we search for these things? Because we have forgotten God. We have forgotten about the Holy Spirit that lives within us. We have forgotten about Jesus, our Lord, Savior, the Messiah.

"The one who seeks will find." in Luke and Matthew Jesus spoke these words to us. So what is the difference **between seek and search? When you search you are looking for something you don't know exists . When you** seek you are looking for something you know you can find. So seek God, seek Him and Him alone. Search no more! Seek the One who was, and is and is to come!

"By myself I can do nothing; I judge only as I hear, and my judgment is just, for I seek not to please myself but only seek Him who sent me." ~ John 5:30



Upon foretelling his death, Jesus comforts the disciples by telling **them that "another Counselor", "another Advocate" is coming.** Jesus speaks about leaving the Spirit of truth, which lives in you and will be with you. He goes so far as to say it is to their <u>advantage</u> **that he leaves so the counselor can come. Jesus'** disciples had no idea what or whom they were waiting for but they trusted Jesus.

The Bible tells of remarkable stories about what the Spirit does in

people's lives. Yet this is not the way it is for most people. For some reason we don't think we need the Spirit. We don't expect the Spirit to act. Our expectations are often misguided or self-serving.

Given our talent set, experience, and education, many of us are capable of living rather successfully (according to the world's standards) without any strength from the Holy Spirit.

Believe it or not even church growth can happen without the Holy Spirit. Let's be honest if you combine a great speaker, a talented worship band, and some hip, creative events, people will attend your church. Yet this does not mean that the Holy Spirit of God is actively working and moving in the lives of the people.


We must be careful not to substitute atmosphere for the presence of God. Are you worshipping based on the atmosphere or because you believe in a living God that is present and alive in your life? This semester my prayer is that we learn something new about the Holy Spirit, that we recognize it, and recognize the work God is doing our life. This is a powerful Spirit that wants to lead and guide us.

My prayer is that our life will be changed by God and God alone and that we will be able to share what the Spirit is doing in our lives!


