A Message From Rev. Carpenter ...

n his book "12 Keys to an Effective Congregation" Kennon Callahan names the top twelve elements for Christian ministry in order of priority. The highest element is "a missional objective" – how does FCC influence the world around us. The second factor is "care" – how well are people cared for.

The best saying I've heard to capture what we're talking about is, "At FCC, no one walks alone." Throughout your years as a member of our congregation, all of you have assisted in the care of someone; many are involved in weekly ministries. Structured ministries where members are involved include:

- Hospital visitations
- Delivering holy communion to folks prevented from attending services
- Contact and relationships with our homebound members
- Delivering our sanctuary flowers to the homebound

Just as important are the ways individuals bear the burden of another. I watch as members consistently help members get to church, overcoming challenges together. I see Sunday School classes keeping up with their folks who are hurting. Our grieving and hurting members testify to the cards and phone calls received from many of you. Illness, long-term disability, challenges of new babies, transitions, surgeries, cancer treatments, and grief – No One Walks Alone at FCC.

A top way to keep FCC strong and effective is through each of us continuing to offer care. As pastor I accompany you in this ministry along with our elders and deacons. One major improvement I will lead this year is the communication of needs. Without dishonoring medical regulations and people's confidentiality requests, I will lead us in keeping you informed of the opportunities we have to walk alongside someone we love.

Currently, these are the best ways to stay connected and prayerful so that no one walks alone:

- Weekly prayer service in the Chapel to include a scripture teaching from our elders, each Sunday 8:00-8:30 AM.
- Call the Church office during the week.
- Reach out to someone that you're concerned about and ask them if they need help.
- Get involved in a Sunday School class and join a smaller community of prayer and information.

Fellowship is holy. Blessed, beloved community glorifies the Lord. We will all be in need at some point, and we will all be in the position to help at others. Whichever we find ourselves in today, may the scriptures be true as Jesus proclaimed:

Whenever you served anyone of my brethren in their time of need, from visitations in hospitals and prisons, to offering food and clothing... you did this unto me.

(Matt 25:40, Pastor's rephrasing)

Houston Mission Trip

Every morning in Houston we worked on two different houses that were effected by Hurricane Harvey. Wanda and Barbara are neighbors who almost completely lost their homes to the hurricane until YWAM Houston came along and offered love and support. Both women have been living with friends and family since the hurricane. Wanda's home will be done this week and Barbara's home should be finished by the end of the summer.

Monday night we worshipped together, then loaded up in vans and went and visited a tent city. We met homeless people and spoke to them about their life and God. Many of them are willing to speak to you about God and Jesus Christ. We learned that as we live in a way where we are constantly thinking about the future and preparing for the week or month in advance, the homeless population are in survival mode. They are only thinking about surviving that day. This explains why when they are given free food; they eat it all, money; they spend it all, drugs; they take them all. They live excessively to us because they don't know if they will make it to the next day.

Tuesday evening we participated in "Hip Hop Hope". This ministry uses Christian culture to build the body of Christ. The church has too often closed itself behind institutional walls. For this reason, Hip Hop Hope partners with churches and provides them with the opportunity to move out of its building to feed, teach, clothe, entertain and evangelize lost souls in their communities. We visited a low-income apartment complex and brought live music, a meal, games, and evangelism to this community. We heard testimony, prayed with parents and older individuals, distributed clothing, and played games with the children.

Wednesday evening we participated in Montrose Street Church. Everyone comes together to reach the often forgotten and ignored at-risk street kids and older homeless in the Montrose area of downtown Houston. Every Wednesday they seek to instill Christian values and give practical assistance through this outreach. Each Wednesday night a church group offers the meal, another group offers worship, and many volunteers come to serve, watch the kids, hand out clothing, and love and pray on the people.

Just like every short-term mission trip so many bonds are made and walking away is difficult. By the grace of God, FCC has begun building a bond and close relationship with YWAM Houston. This was our second trip to Houston this year and we have another planned for July. Mission work is about hard work but is mostly about building relationships with people and pointing them to God. To hear testimonies, pray with someone, give of your time, worship with the homeless, play with children, and shine the light of Christ is missions wherever you go and wherever you are.

Thank you to those who supported us and prayed for this trip. This is the second of many that FCC will become involved with in order to know God and to make Him known. God Bless You!



Praying in Public ... Marilyn Wragg

Do you find it intimidating to pray in public? If you are one of many who do, this article is lovingly dedicated to you.

When I first started praying as an Elder at the Lord's Table, my hands shook so much that it took both hands to take communion afterward to avoid spilling. I kept telling myself I was not there to impress, but to offer prayers to our Father on behalf of the congregation. While I very much want public prayers to be meaningful to those present, it helps me always to remember that it is God I am addressing—God, Who loves us and knows what we are trying to relay whether or not words come out just right.

The suggestions in this article have helped me become progressively more comfortable praying in public. I pray they will help you if you find it difficult to do so.

P.S. There is one additional bit of advice to which I adhere Take prayer *very* **seriously**, **but don't take** *yourself* too seriously. After I have poorly articulated a public prayer, I

- Pray often, and continually increase the scope of your prayers. The best way to become better at praying in public is to pray more in private. The more frequently we talk with God, the more readily words flow.
- Pray out loud. This not only helps us focus in private prayer, but it also accustoms us to hearing our own voice pray. That makes it easier to move to praying in front of others.
- Pray aloud with family members and close friends. Practice offering mealtime blessings, and expand beyond rote prayers. Pray aloud with children or other loved ones at bedtime.
- Pray in small groups of folks with whom you are comfortable, such as a small Bible study.
- Gradually expand to larger groups as you feel led. Trust that God will equip you to pray when the opportunity or need arises.

sigh lightheartedly and silently pray, "Lord, You know what I was trying to say; I trust Your Spirit will translate it for others."

Sharing the Gospel at Bean Elementary Good News! By Marcy Lawless



We at FCC have a wonderful opportunity to spread the good news of the Gospel with students at Bean Elementary this coming fall! In response to an inquiry from staff at the school, we've agreed to step out in faith and begin a weekly after-school program called the "Good News Club" (GNC), a ministry of Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF).

Child Evangelism Fellowship was established in 1937 and is the largest mission agency to children around the world, reaching an average of 15.6 million children each year. They work in unity with churches, schools and communities. The first question often asked in the United States is, "Can the Bible be taught in public schools?" The answer came in 2001 when the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in Good News Clubs v Milford Central School that "Good News Clubs can meet in public schools in the United States after school hours on the same terms as other community groups." There currently are six LISD elementary schools and three additional schools in the Lubbock area that offer GNC's.


The basics of the program include:

- Once a week after school (day is yet to be determined) from 3:30-5 p.m. at Bean
- Bible lessons prepared by CEF, along with colorful materials, posters, and video, with each lesson including:
 - A clear presentation of the Gospel on a child's level
 - Songs with hand motions
 - Scripture memory
 - A Mission story
 - ° Review games and awards based on the lesson's theme

Based on the numbers of children who sign up (parental approval is required), we will need a minimum of 6-8 volunteers. Twice that number would be perfect, as it would mean we'd have people ready to step in whenever someone in leadership needs to miss a week. CEF provides training for team members—a requirement--as well as teaching materials, programs, mentoring and staff support.

Is teaching part of your background? Is part of your unfolding in God's Kingdom and timing a desire on your heart to reach children for Jesus? There are brochures and a sign up sheet on the Bean table near the coffee shop. Please know that you aren't signing up as a commitment but rather, as one who would like to gather information so that you may pray and know if this is what the Lord is calling you to do. We will have a meeting over the summer of all who have an interest and we can't wait to see who and what God has

planned for this ministry!
