God's Poetry for His People

Included in the middle of your Bible is a collection of 150 Spirit-breathed poems, songs, and expressions of real people facing real joy and relatable problems. Like us, the people who wrote the psalms also had affections for God, trust in His timing, and saw Him as their greatest hope.

Many of our congregants' favorite scriptures are found in the psalms. "The Lord is my Shepherd," Psalm 23; "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me," Psalm 51; "Know that the Lord is God. We are his people we are the sheep of his pasture," Psalm 100; "As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God," Psalm 42; "A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing," Psalm 46.

The center verse of the entire Bible is Psalm 118:8, "It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in man." Martin Luther calls the Psalms a "little Bible." It is full of truth, repentance, grace, and reminders of God's faithfulness.

When Jesus suffered for us on the cross, he invoked Psalm 22, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When the Jews walked up the mountain to Jerusalem for holy days, they would sing together Psalms 120-134, with 121 saying "I lift my eyes unto the hills – where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth."

I invite you to **join me in a practice** that brings me great joy and has allowed God to set the mood for my day. Beginning in the morning I enjoy five psalms that awaken my heart for Jesus. I begin with the Psalm of that day of the month and add "30" four times. For example on September 17th, I enjoyed: Psalm 17; Psalm 47; Psalm 77; Psalm 107; Psalm 137.

Two tips: (1) Enjoy the psalms before you read or listen to anything "out there." Delay the news, Facebook, emails. Start with this time with our Lord and have Him set your heart in place before entering the world. (2) Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible; I recommend skipping that one and saving it to be read alone on the 31st of the month.

Let me know how this helps you. I love to hear from our folks and how God is working in your life. I leave you with Psalm 145:8, "The LORD is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love."

We have also confirmed a world-class bible



In the Life of the Church.. by Deborah Bigness

On Monday, October 24, 1921, the Ladies Aid Society of the First Christian Church met in the "cozy" home of Mrs. W.J. Duncan on Cedar Street (now Texas Avenue), according to the *Lubbock Avalanche*. "Quite a large crowd were present" and they enjoyed "delicious refreshments" and rooms decorated "appropriate to fall and Halloween." The group voted unanimously to "pack a box of clothing and other useful items for the Juliette Fowler Orphans Home" at their next meeting.

Now known as the Juliette Fowler Communities, it was the dream of Juliette Peak Fowler. While she did not live to see it, her sister, Sarah Peak Harwood, made the dream a reality with Juliette's bequests and chartered the Juliette Fowler Home for Children and the Aged in 1892. Sarah created a formal association with the Disciples of Christ in 1903 and the first home for children opened the next year.

Pray From the Sidelines...Marilyn Wragg

Laurie Williams recently introduced me to "Sideline Supporters." This Christian ministry reaches out to football players and coaches to encourage them and to reinforce good character and sportsmanship. It grew from one woman's experience a few years ago, when she was prompted to send encouraging words and scriptures to a sports figure who was having a tough year and being broadly criticized. He later wrote back to say how much it had meant knowing at least one person out there supported and prayed for him.

Sideline Supporters currently covers three football teams: Texas Tech, Texas A&M, and the University of Texas. For Texas Tech, 130 volunteers are paired with 130 players and coaches. Through the season, each volunteer commits daily to pray for the designated player or coach and weekly to send a note of encouragement that includes a Bible verse. Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. *Ephesians 4:29*

Unable to resist this unique prayer opportunity, I signed up. Three

weeks into the season, I am so glad I did. Praying for my assigned individual, I ask God to equip him to do his best and succeed. And while, "Yes, Lord, a super season would be so appreciated," I mostly pray for God's blessings in all areas of his life and for his growing sense of God's presence. For discipline and perspective both on and off the field, and awareness of what is truly important in life. That he give God glory and trust in Him, rather than basing security on performance or positive press. And conversely, in the face of adversity on and off the field, that he maintain courage and character.

While I trust God to work through this ministry to bless players and coaches, He is also changing the way I watch Tech football. When I find my tension building, I ask God to keep me from abandoning those noble things I have prayed all week and help me pray them through the game. As I see specific players make good—or bad—plays, or watch coaches in action, I remember that earthly victories are fleeting and pray that each player and coach builds endurance and character and ultimately hope of eternal "victory in Jesus."

How cool would it be if more and more of us Tech (or Aggie or UT or other) fans became Sideline Supporters—praying, encouraging, and building up these coaches and players who represent our favorite universities. While it will not guarantee a winning score, it definitely will change hearts, build character, and bring glory to God. I challenge each of you, as I am challenging myself, to pray from the sidelines this season.



This past month Paul and I had the privilege of attending the Getty Music Sing! 2018 conference in Nashville, Tennessee.
