I just read the last chapter of Acts and was vividly reminded how alive and active God's word is when I came to Acts 28:14b: "And so we came to Rome." This verse, which I have skimmed over many times before, this time leapt straight into my heart.

Morning Glory Muffins

2½ c. all purpose flour
1½ c. sugar
3 tsp. ground cinnamon
2 tsp. baking soda
½ tsp. salt
3 eggs
½ c. applesauce
½ c. vegetable oil
1tsp. vanilla extract
2 c. carrots, peeled and grated
1 med. tart apple, peeled and grated
1 (8oz.) can crushed pineapple, drained
½ c. raisins
½ c. chopped pecans

Directions

In a large bowl, combine the first five ingredients. In another bowl, combine the eggs, applesauce, oil and vanilla. Stir into dry ingredients just until moistened (batter will be thick). Stir in carrots, apple, pineapple, coconut, raisins, and nuts. Fill greased or paper-lined muffin cups ²/₃ full. Bake at 350 for 20-40 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing to wire rack. Yield: 2 dozen.

I remember my grandparents telling me of their experience of the Great Depression with mass unemployment and people waiting in long lines for a bowl of soup. The world had turned upside down and the times were uncertain.

I remember my father telling me about his memories of World War II. He said that our country was rationing fuel and other products to support the war effort and women were working in factories taking the place of men that had gone to war. Most of Europe was under the

In the Life of the Church by Deborah Bigness

On the evening of May 11, 1970, two tornados struck the city of Lubbock. Both were deadly, but later studies indicated that the second funnel, that touched down at 19th and University Avenue moving northeast, grew to a width of 2 miles with winds over 260 mph – the first official F5 tornado. Fifty years ago this month, our church family and our community experienced one of the most serious events in our history.

Within an hour of the storm, 45 refugees were sheltered in the church's basement while ministers Dudley Strain, Claude Weingand, Neil Guy, and Johnnie Davis were offering their assistance at stricken apartment complexes and at hospitals. Beginning the next day, the congregation's efforts were concentrated at the Municipal Coliseum, the primary shelter and distribution center helping with coordination, child care, transportation, and food preparation. The church suffered wind and water damage but it was not severe. The tornados of May 11, 1970, injured nearly 2,000 residents, and took the lives of 26. The Lubbock Memorial Civic Center is dedicated to their memory.
