New Re-stated Certificate of Formation, Bylaws, and 2021 Budget Approved at Congregational Meeting..... Thank You for Your Participation!

After many years, we have adopted a new Certificate of Formation and Re-stated our Bylaws bringing them up to date with all required state statutes. These documents were approved in a meeting of the congregation during services this past Sunday and will be effective on January 1, 2021. The vote, with 260 members present in both services combined, brought a conclusion to a project that has been ongoing for about four years. The new certificate will be filed with the Secretary of State in the next couple of weeks. We also approved the 2021 General Operating Budget during the meeting. Thank you to all who were present this past Sunday.

In a year when so much has changed, so will how we observe Christmas together. Our traditional *Hanging of the Greens* ceremony will not happen this year, but our marvelous staff will ensure that the church building still reflects the season with evergreens. The language of symbols predates written language and the plants we most closely associate with Christmas are full of traditional symbolism that speaks to believers.

Spruce boughs, like the one pictured here, represent hope in adversity. Pine reminds us of the meaning of eternal life while its cones, that are actually seedpods, represent new life and resurrection. Even the shapes of our Christmas evergreens are symbolic. The triangular shape of our Christmas trees embodies the Holy Trinity of The Father, The Son and The Holy Ghost. Wreaths, being circular with no end or beginning, represent the eternity of God, the immortal soul, and everlasting life. So, this Christmas, take heart from the symbols of hope that surround you.
